C., March 13.—(U.P.)—General Smedley Butler's charges that Colonel Williams, his predecessor at San Diego marine base, acted unbecomingly following a party where drinks were served, will be ruled upon by Major General John Lejuene, marine commandant, after the formal complaint has been received from the west coast some time next week, it was announced today.
General Lejuene is the superior officer who must approve or disapprove of the charge.
