"That committee and its chairman were elected by the friends of all candidates, both active, mentioned or receptive, and none of them have any right to pretend to select a candidate for the republicans of this state to ratify.

### Always Repudiated

"The leaders of the ring that has continuously picked candidates for the last 20 years, only to have them repudiated by the people in the election of democratic governors, are active again and the so-called endorsement in Benton county is one more obstacle to be overcome in the effort to find someone who can defeat Governor Pierce at the general election.

"If I cannot win the nomination in a fair and open contest, I want to support a man good enough to beat me in a fair race. Such old gang methods as the one now being attempted by the officers, active and retired, of the state committee through subterranean influences upon the

county committee, can only result in some such resentment against a corrupt system which the people have repudiated, that a republican governor may be the last thing we can hope to secure.

"The people of Oregon are not going to be led by bosses nor misled by intrigue."
