

GREETERS WILL ENLARGE NATIONAL HOME AT ONCE

The national home in Denver of the Greeters of America is to be enlarged by the immediate construction of a new unit to cost \$20,000, according to announcement made by E. C. Bennett, proprietor of the Kenmark hotel and treasurer of the Greeters home fund. The treasury of the Greeters has \$32,000 in Liberty bonds, so that the new structure, when completed, will be entirely free of debt. It will accommodate sixteen persons and will constitute the first unit of a proposed building extension system that will finally cover the entire block bounded by Ulster and Uintah streets, and Seventeenth and Eighteenth avenues.

This block is owned outright by the Greeters and an 8-room dwelling has been used for inmates for several years. The site, comprising five acres, is one of the best in Denver for

such a purpose. "We have the property free from all debt," said Bennett, Thursday, "and will have over \$12,000 cash in the treasury when the new unit is completed. Our home is becoming national in scope and we have good reason to expect that it will develop along the lines of the famous Union Printers home in Colorado Springs, in the coming years.

"The new structure will be of brick and later we intend to build a central heating plant and culinary building for kitchen and dining-room purposes. Our units will consist of small fireproof bungalow structures to the full capacity of our entire site. These can all be heated and served from the central plant and in time we will have a large institution."

Recently the funds of the Greeters home were swelled by donations of \$500 each from the

hotel associations of New York, New Jersey, New England and the Rocky Mountains. Donations are expected from every state. Hotel association in the Union as the home is free to any of the 5,000 members of the Greeters recruited from every state who may in time have need of its services.

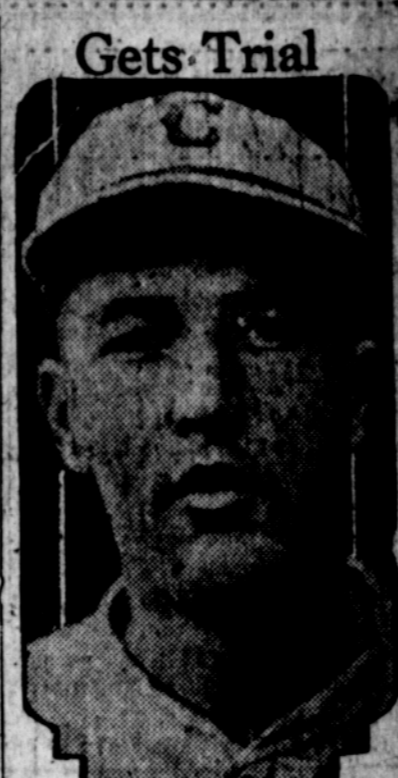
Auto Owners Defended
Senator Upton also scored the tendency to add increasing burdens to the shoulders of automobile owners and made the promise that in the event of his election, he will veto any bill which might seek to add another cent to the gasoline tax. The high license fees, together with the gasoline tax, the headlight law, the certificate of title law and other regulations are all making the life of the automobile owner a burden which will result in a serious over-throw, unless some halt is taken, he declared. He called attention to the fact that real property is now paying an annual tax of \$7,000,000 in Oregon, whereas the automobile owners are paying \$9,000,000 in taxes of various kinds.

For Ashland Normal
The speaker reviewed briefly the last legislative session and the fight made on behalf of the Ashland normal school. Eastern Oregon senators and representatives, he said, had an organization which always stuck together on all measures in order to win recognition for their section. But in the matter of the Ashland normal school, he broke away from his colleagues and worked for the bill because he thought it just and because he is a firm believer in every possible educational advantage for young men and women.

Other Speakers
Senator Upton was introduced by State Senator George Dunn, who spoke highly on Mr. Upton's record in the state senate. H. H. De Armond of Bend spoke briefly on community cooperation and praised the women of Ashland for the keen interest they appeared to be showing in the work of the chamber of commerce.

John V. Bennis, architect, and J. J. Tranchal, contractor, for the new normal school, also spoke briefly. One of the largest gatherings in some time attended the luncheon and accorded Senator Upton a real ovation.
