BERLIN, March 17-(U.P.)-General interest has been aroused by Dr. Joseph Schumacher's recent announcement of his discovery of the cancer virus of the Microbiological Society of Berlin. This interest, however, is tempered by considerable scepticism in medical circles. Some prominent specialists even refuse point-blank to lend credence to Dr. Schumacher's claims.

Dr. Schumacher himself, interviewed by the United Press, explained that his discoveries can be traced to recent experiments on the destruction of gernfs by ferments produced within the human body. Contrary to the British scientists, who recently claimed to have ascertained the existence of the cancer virus among germs so minute as to slip between two rays of daylight and therefore favisible to the ordinary microscope. Dr. Schumacher conceived the idea of searching among bacilli which are larger but invisible on account of their chemical inability

to absorb coloring matter. After applying unsuccessfully all the usual dyeing methods, Dr. Schumacher says that he discovered a process, by which he was able to dye the suspected parasites a beautiful red, whereas the surrounding tissues ap- and he thinks that good results peared deep blue.
