AIRPLANE TRAVEL SOON TO BE CHEAP

SAN FRANCISCO, March 18.—(UP)—Passengers will be able to travel over the United States by airplane in the near future as cheaply as they can now travel by rail, according to the prediction of Irving W. Glover, second assistant postmaster general.

A system of airplanes, in a network over the country, Glover believes, will be the development of only a few years hence. "We can see evidence that air travel will soon be brought well within the means of the masses," he said. "The rapid development of the air mail is a forerunner of this."

PARIS GETS GOOD LAUGH

PARIS — (UP) — Moral turpitude, its nature and its effect on the entry of aliens into the United States, as evidence in the case of the Countess Cathcart, stirred French satirists to launch barbed shafts at American codes of ethics.

That the Countess was barred on having admitted that she had been divorced caused shrieks of ironical laughter from those acquainted with the fact that Paris has taken away Reno's laurels as a divorce mill.

One suggestion made is that when an American woman lands at Cherbourg or Havre she be forced to answer questions such as these: "Are you married, and if so are you living happily with your husband?"

In case the new arrival answers in the affirmative she must submit proof, failing which she must be at once taken to the woman's prison at St. Lazare, there to wait the sailing of the next boat for the United States. Such a procedure, it is said, should be applied especially in the case of film queens and in fact to every woman traveling alone.

"Do you intend to visit Montmartre and if so why?" is a question which certain experts consider would force any woman to give the desired information.
