Early last fall County Health Officer Dr. G. S. Newsom sounded a warning that unless proper sewage facilities were provided for the Fairview residential sectyphoid fever epidemic this summer.

City officials some weeks ago started preliminary work looking toward the construction of sewers in Fairview, but with the typhoid epidemic now in progress, it is feared that several lives will be lost before the inroads of the dreaded disease can be halted.
