 SAN FRANCISCO, March 19.—(U.P.)—A majority of prohibition, coast guard and customs officials on the Pacific coast favor a centralized administration of all coast patrol affairs, according to Ned M. Green, prohibition director here.
 Green is actively interested in a proposal to merge the various separate administrations. His program has not been given unanimous approval, however, although it has attracted much favorable comment.
 The customs collectors on the coast are entirely in favor of the move.
