TOO MANY LISTENERS

Mrs. A. H. Reinhardt of Oakland, California, president of the National Association of University woman, at a meeting of a branch of that organization at Atlantic City, dwelt on the idea that there are too many listeners and not enough workers. Her idea was that the women of educational organizations have become too fond of act ing as an audience with some paid speaker as an entertainer.

A good many women who belong to clubs and literary and civic organizations will say this is so, and that many of their members spend a great deal of time listening to addresses and lecturers, and not enough time carrying out the ideas thus presented. The men also do much listening which is not accompanied by appropriate action.

We hear an enormous amount of good talk in churches, clubs, business organizations, etc., and feel very virtuous as we appland these sentiments, and then go out

And vet a good listener may be very useful. These people who attend lectures and talks on community subjects become intelligent on these questions. When such subjects come up for action, such ones can exert a helpful influence, and they do a great deal to correct wrong ideas that get started in the community. It may seem as if the utterances of some good speaker are lost on his audience as they drink in his words, and then go out and do nothing about it. And yet if they have been convinced of the merit of useful ideas, and if the falsity of wrong notions has been made clear to them, they constitute a kind of leavening force that tones up the intelligence of the community.

So let us not stop listening to good talks, and feel that time thus spent is valueless. But to make it count,


