PORTLAND, Ore., March 27-Calvin E. McCurdy, for 17 years a mail carrier in the Portland postoffice, was indicted Thursday on three counts by the federal jury for alleged embezzlement of a letter on March 4. The bill accuses him of opening the letter, addressed to the Eastern Outfitting company, and taking the contents, amounting to \$3 in cash and a passbook. McCurdy is under arrest.
