MANY REFUGEES ARE FLOCKING TO PEKING

PEKING, March 27—(U.P.)—Thousands of refugees are pouring into Peking today and relief stations have been established throughout the city. The nationalist troops are standing 20 miles from the city limits while peace negotiations continue to prevent a battle for control of the city. Rumors of fighting are being circulated on all sides, but the coalition forces have not yet attacked the city.

SOUTHERN OREGON CLINIC HAS ADDED PERSONNEL

During the last season gross revenues from football amounted to \$457,016.46, and net profits amounted to \$221,901.06. Receipts from other forms of collegiate athletics did not amount to more than a few hundred dollars.

Much of the profits, according to a report of Graduate Manager Luther A. Nichols, went to carry other athletic activities. The final installment on the Memorial Stadium was paid out of profits from last season's football.
