HUMAN LIFE CANNOT BE PROLONGED INDEFINITELY

SAN FRANCISCO, March 31 (U.P.)—No matter to what extent the refinements of science are developed, it will be impossible to indefinitely prolong human life, according to Dr. Samuel J. Holmes, zoologist of the University of California and author.

"It's all boah," he said, "this talk about the possibility of indefinitely extending the length of life. Although scientists are able to keep cells from the human body living far past the normal life of the organism from which they were taken, when these cells are in the body no such unnatural length of life is at all probable." The results of "test tube" science cannot be transferred to the human body always, he said.

Dr. Holmes said that although the average length of life may have been increased greatly during the past century, the number of centenarians living today is probably no greater than it was in olden days.

"While no man of science would want to say that immortality of the body, or increasing life to 100 or 200 years, is impossible, it is extremely improbable," he continued. "In science there is no exact truth, there is only a probability which may be large enough to yield certainty. I should say that it is not impossible to fly to the moon, for example, but the probabilities for this are about one in many million."

BUTLER SAYS HOLLYWOOD JUST LIKE PHILADELPHIA HOLLYWOOD.—(U.P.)—"I've been fooled by Hollywood," admitted General Smedley D. Butler, former vice crusader for Philadelphia.

"I thought I'd find all the buildings like picture sets and the streets full of bathing beauties. Instead, it's just like Philadelphia, or Boston, or any other city."

General Butler inspected the film plants and elegant homesites of the stars while en route to San Diego where he has assumed charge of the marine post.

"I had no idea Hollywood was like this," concluded the Marine chief.

VETERAN CUTTER TO SAIL THIS SPRING

SAN FRANCISCO.—(U.P.)—The veteran coast guard cutter Bear will sail out of the Golden Gate in May and turn her bow northward on her annual "inward" trip to Alaskan and Arctic waters.

Each year brings reports that the old coast guard patrol ship is to be replaced by a modern vessel—but each spring mariners see her back again in the far North.

The cutter seems old enough to retire. She was built in 1857 in Scotland and began sailing for Uncle Sam in 1855. She has been crushed by ice, stranded and battered by heavy seas, and nearly lost many times. Yet her timbers are sound.

No steel vessel could stand the crush of ice the way the Bear's wooden hull has done. Arctic sailors say. None is greater in his praise for the Bear than is Captain C. S. Cochran.

"I'm glad to get another chance to go back to the 'top of the world' on her," Cochran said, when he learned he was assigned to command the vessel on this summer's trip. Unlike many officers on the coast guard service, who seek shore duty, Captain Cochran has always been a willing master of the craft.

"Last year I was condemned to shore duty," he said. "I guess I have taken the Bear up north more than any other coast guard officer. They say the icy seas are full of perils, but I never worried. The cutter has brought her men back safely dozens of times and she'll do it again."

"It seems a shame to think that someday, not long hence, the Bear will be tied up here in Puget Sound to rot, but I guess she's doomed for that fate."

"She's piled up on the shore and in the ice so many times that it is a cinch she won't quit working that way."
