HIGHWAY LIGHTHOUSES

The Automobile Association of Australia is trying out highway lighthouses in rural districts. Continuous, flashing lights, housed much as are the lights in marine beacons, are mounted on concrete bases and stand about nine feet high. They operate day and hight, indicating concealed highest cross-roads, dangerous curves, steep grades, radroad crossings, and so on. They are visible for long distances and thus give ample warning.
