MOST MOTORISTS BREAK FERRY STARTING LAW

WASHINGTON, April 2—(U. P.)—Nearly all motorists are violating the law prohibiting the starting of engines on ferry boats before the vessels have docked, Arthur J. Tryer, Deputy Commissioner of Navigation of the Department of Commerce, has found.

Within two months after the law went into effect last year, inspectors of the department reported 2,000 violations. Tryer concedes that some violations of the law are unwilling because of conditions that motorists meet when travelling on ferries.

COPENHAGEN (U. P.)—For toothsome and skillful seasoning, the canned goods of the Soviet Republic walked off with nine honorary diplomas at the International Exposition of the Canning Industry here.

EVACUATIONS DISCLOSE ANCIENT RUSSIAN CITY

MOSCOW (U. P.)—Ruins of the ancient 12th century city of Tschestlow—at one time Moscow's rival for the position of metropolis of Russia—have been found and the site which has long been a matter of historical uncertainty has been definitely placed on the banks of the Okar river about 70 miles south of Moscow.

In the immediate neighborhood have also been found perhaps the most remarkable archeological remains in Russia—dug-outs containing articles evidently dating from the 4th and 5th centuries, B. C. Among them are arrows and combs.
