MOST MOTORISTS BREAK

WASHINGTON, April 2-(U. .) -Nearly all motorists are violating the law prohibiting the starting of engines on ferryboats before the vessels have docked, Arthur J. Tryer, Deputy Commissioner of Navigation of the Department of Commerce, has found.

Within two months after the law went into effect last year, inspectors of the department reported 2,000 violations. Tryer concedes that some violations of the law are unwillful because of conditions that motorists meet when travelling on ferries.
