WASHINGTON, April 7—(U.P.)—Americans have developed a "sweet tooth" and since prohibition consumption of milk chocolate alone has increased more than 600 percent, according to the Agriculture Department.  
More than 290,000,000 pounds of milk were used in the manufacture of milk chocolate last year as compared with only 40,000,000 pounds in 1921.
