**FOOTBALL HERO AT CALIFORNIA PASSES**

SAN FRANCISCO, April 13 (U.P.)—Lee G. Duff, only University of California football hero who never played in a varsity game, is dead.

He died after battling for more than 20 years the effects of injuries received while playing at the university. Duff was buried with all the honors the university accorded those who have carried the name of its campus to the far corners. Yet he never left Berkeley in a score of years. To all but old grads and faculty members his name meant little. He was "the man in the wheel chair" who watched the games with wistful eyes.

Back of Duff's interest was grim story softened by memories of a few glorious weeks when he dreamed of dodging through fields of Stanford players and carrying the ball beyond the goal posts for California.

Duff, a member of a prominent New York family, came west 30 years ago. When he was 18 he entered the university and went out for football. One afternoon Duff was in the heart of the roughest scrimmage. The referee's whistle blew as a struggling group of players fell. The others scrambled to their feet. But Duff lay there. It was his last game.
