POUNDAGE FOR FORD BALLOON TIRE GIVEN

Under-inflation of balloon tire costs the owner just 700 miles of service per pound under the correct pressure, according to the results of a series of experiments by the Ford Motor Company. These experiments were conducted in connection with a campaign to help Ford car owners get the most out of their tires.

To determine just which point the Ford six balloon tires—29x4.40—yielded the maximum comfort to passengers consistent with maximum mileage, all makes of tires were tested. At the end of the test period, the exact loss per pound of under-inflation was calculated in terms of mileage and a bulletin was sent to Ford dealers and service stations advising the correct pressures.

A number of common tire ailments were traced back to under-inflation. Among the most common are rim cuts, tread separation, over-heating and stone bruising in addition to a more rapid rate of natural wear and deterioration.

On the other hand, every pound of over-inflation takes its toll of comfort and the fundamental value of balloon equipment is lost. Other advantages of low pressure tires, namely greater traction, ability to travel over soft ground without sinking and quick stopping without skidding, are also nullified in a direct ratio to the extent of the excessive air pressure.

The following inflation table has been proven to best combine riding comfort with long life in 29x4.40 balloon tires:

UNION OIL COMPANY WINS UNIQUE HONOR

For the first time, the Abraham Lincoln humanitarian award has been won by a corporation. This unique honor goes to the Union Oil Company of California in recognition of its Be Careful campaign. Announcement to this effect was made yesterday by the Oregon Humane Society which made the award.

In a telegram to W. L. Stewart, President of the Union Oil Company of California, Mrs. F. W. Swanton, of the Oregon Humane Society, stated: "I take great pleasure in informing you that your fine posters on safety first when driving have been noticed and commented upon favorably all over the country. You have won the great honor of receiving the gold and bronze Oregon Humane Society Abraham Lincoln humanitarian award for cooperation."

The Union's safety campaign was inaugurated some months ago when investigation showed that the automobile accident situation was becoming acute. The Union officials went on the premise that automobile drivers were not, as a general rule, deliberately careless, but rather were victims of the urge for greater speed, which is inherent in so many motorists.

It was felt that if some means could be evolved which would bring home to the careless motorist the folly of his actions, a hat would be called to the growing total of automobile accidents. The present campaign which provided for the utilization of 1,500 posters on the Pacific Coast typifying motorist situations in which careful driving is necessary and which carry a direct and positive appeal to observe safe driving practices was therefore inaugurated.

OLD VETERAN WOULD REMAIN IN SERVICE

SAN FRANCISCO, April 15.—(UP)—"Well, I don't know what I'd do if they kicked me out of the army now," declared James H. (Pop) Johnson, Civil War veteran and 81-year-old field clerk

attached to the quarter-master corps at Fort Mason here. "I went into the army when I was 14 and I've been at it ever since—that's 87 years, isn't it? I'm sort of used to this army life now."

Pop is worried a bit about a new pension bill which may let him out.

"There's a bill before Congress now or something about retiring us oldtimers. If the bill passes, well, I guess I'd have to build a little house near here somewhere and stick around anyway."

"They can't put me out now because the quarter-master corps is not on the pension list."

Johnson fought in the Civil War, re-enlisted and fought through the Indian uprisings. He was in service during the Spanish-American war, the Philippine insurrection and the Boxer campaign. He transferred to the quarter-master department here in 1906. During the world War he was found physically fit for service overseas but he never got

away from Fort Mason.

"Retire from the army? I should say not," he replied when he was asked why he didn't quit service voluntarily. "There are several of us old fellows doing duty. There is Nat Poyntz, 80 years old, at Boston and there is a fellow named Howard P. Snyder, who is somewhere around 80. We're the oldest soldiers."

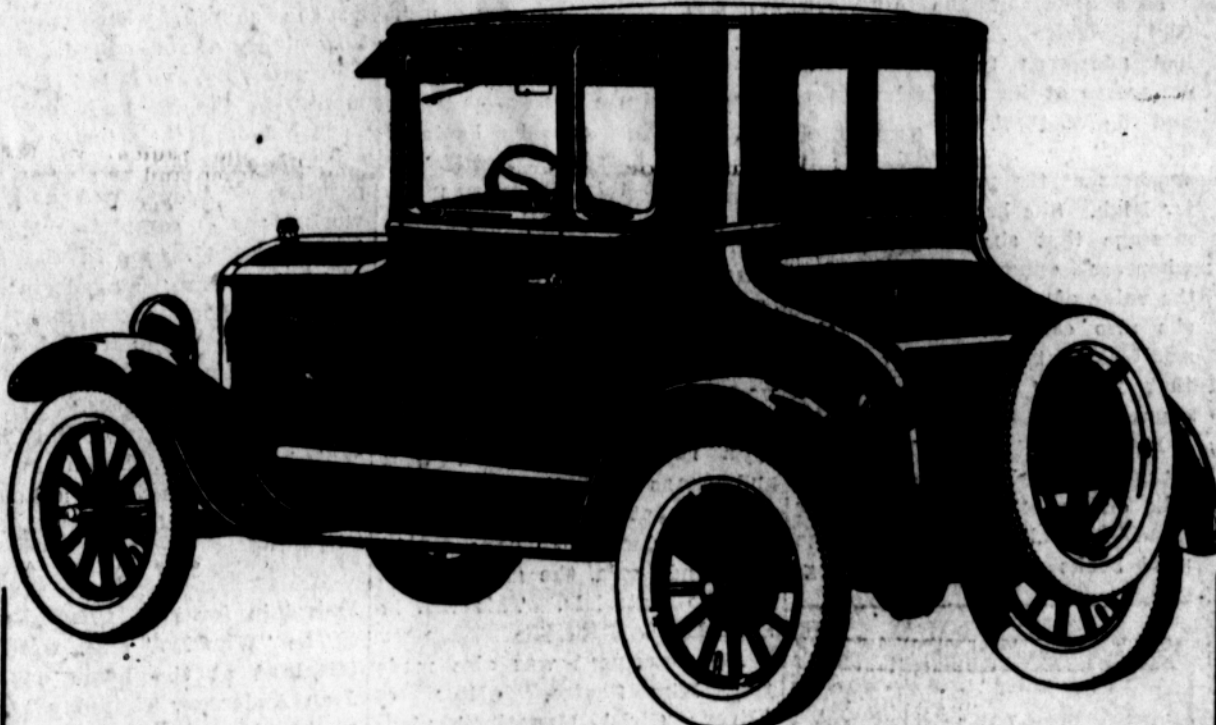

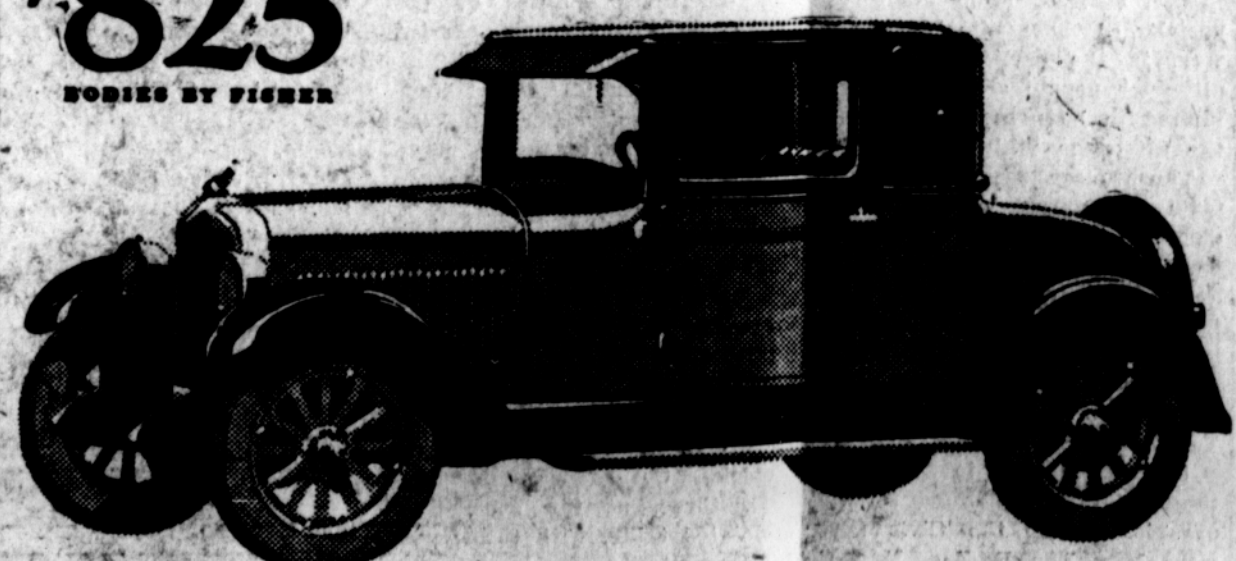
