"BE KIND TO ANIMALS" WEEK

The dates for 1934 "Internat-
ional, Be Kind to Animals"
Week, are April 12-17. This
week, set aside for the purpose
of centering the thoughts of the
world upon "being a good turn"
to the animal kingdom, holds
the promise for a regular bless-
ing for all humanity, since the
"inasmuch" to the least of these
brings back to the donor a far
greater blessing in the spirit of
compassion, aroused in his own
heart, which makes him a part-
aker of the divinest thing that
can come to a human soul.

Oregon has a membership of
17,400 in its state branch, with
245 associations. Suppose that
in every school and home (thus
represented we could have em-
phasized even for one day, this
theme of kindness to every liv-
ing thing! What a monument

of good-will we would be erect-
ing in the hearts of the child-
ren of the state, and what a
mighty force it would be in es-
tablishing "the great law of
mercy" now everywhere because
of failure in the past to educate
youth to "do justly and love
mercy."

There are many things that
can be done by parents and
teachers to make this week a
successful and memorable one.
Essay and poster contests on
kindness in the school, organiza-
tion of bands of mercy, assembly
or class-room talks to the pupils
upon the subject of fair play
for animals as well as humans,
with emphasis upon the injustice
to animals forced to perform in
vaudeville and circuses, and not
forgetting the crime of the re-
deo or round-up, the lawless and
commercialized shame of Amer-
ica.
