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## CONVERSION OF FLAPPER TO POLITICS IS PLANNED

ST. LOUIS, April 15 (U.P.)—Conversion of the flapper to a realization of the importance of practical politics constituted the major problem on the program for discussion when the League of Women Voters met here Wednesday in its seventh annual convention.

Seven years ago a small group of determined women who believed that the millions just enfranchised by the women's suffrage amendment should be educated to vote intelligently met here to form the League of Women Voters.

Today delegates to the League now a strong national organization, with branches in virtually every state in the union returned to consider action on a dozen or more major social problems and review the work of seven years as their annual convention.

Every train bore delegates from state and city branches of the League, now an important factor in the politics of the nation. All shades of opinion will be represented and out of the discussion will be formulated the program of the organization. Members, as soon as they arrived, registered at convention headquarters and before nightfall close to 1,000 had registered. Conferences Wednesday were on "Efficiency in Government," led by Miss Belle Sherwin, national president, "Social Hygiene," "Women in Industry," "Child Welfare," "International Cooperation," and "Living Costs."

Perhaps the most interesting session of the five-day convention will be the effort to "convert" the flapper to a realization of the importance of "practical politics." Three women who are political "horses" in their own localities, will speak. They are Miss Marie Wink, member of the Cleveland City Council, Mrs. J. Paul Gooder, of Chicago, member of the Illinois legislature, and Mrs. John T. Pratt, member of the Board of Aldermen of New York City.
