WAR DESTRUCTION REPAID IN CHINA

PEKING, April 21—(U.P.)—Although the "Christian General" Feng Yuh-shang resigned his military command some time ago, he has issued an announcement for distribution of relief funds to compensate those who suffered through the recent capture of Tientsin and subsequent fighting.

Families of persons killed are to receive Mex \$50 (about 100 U. S.) for each death. Persons disabled by wounds will receive Mex \$50. Wounded are to receive Mex \$20. For each totally destroyed house Mex \$30 will be paid for each room in the case of damaged houses, Mex \$10 will be given for each room; for loss of horses, cattle and other live stock compensation.
