Broken Arms Is Inventor's Gift Daily Dozen For

SAN FRANCISCO.—Broken arms is among the latest innovations of Patrick Flanagan, chief engineer of Southern Pacific's general hospital at San Francisco, who prefers to dedicate the mechanical contrivances of his inventive genius to the service of humanity rather than to patent and sell them for profit.

With more than a score of successful surgical inventions to his credit, some of which would have produced a comfortable income had he cared to exploit them commercially, Flanagan spends his spare time in hospital wards and operating rooms devising improvements in implements and equipment. These when perfected, he offers without price to the world at large.

His mechanical splint for arm fractures has gained wide popularity. By merely turning a thumb screw the patient may, as soon as the bones are knit and long before bandages can be removed, flex and exercise the arm. By the time bandages can be discarded the convalescent's arm has lost all stiffness and in most cases may be used freely. Thus the mechanical splint does away with the period of flexing and massage usually required when injury is healed.
