## TRIBUTE TO MOTHER PENNED BY CONVICT

SAN RAFAEL, Cal., April 27.—(UP)—The May 1 issue of San Quentin prison's publication—The Bulletin—gives honor to the mothers San Quentin's inmates did not heed. The Bulletin for May 1 is dedicated to "Somebody's Mother." Lloyd Sampson, associate editor, penned the text. It reads: "She was oddly picturesque against the forbidding grayness of the battlements which formed the massive entrance to the prison. Past middle age, dressed obviously in her out-of-date best, she stood trembling nervously before the prison gate, the accumulated terrors of her journey furrowed in her brow. Behind these walls some one for whom she'd dare the horrors of the inquisition or the battlements of hell awaited her coming, and come she had, to bring assurances that as always, she'd share the load he bore. Somebody's mother; Man's most futile and yet noblest endeavor is the worthy acknowledgment of love, homage and respect for his mother. May it be said of the prison that, here, more than anywhere on God's green earth, is the mother appreciated and the fullest significance of "Mother's Day" understood and acknowledged."

## ORDER OF DE MOLAY PLANS BIG SERVICE

KANSAS CITY, Mo., April 27.—More than two hundred thousand members of the Order of DeMolay, belonging to fifteen hundred chapters in the United States, will observe Patriot's Day, May 1, with special programs, according to announcement from national headquarters in this city, by Frank S.
