and he predicted that every committee and every man on each committee would work industriously during the year for the betterment of the city.

#### Secretary Fuller submitted a report of the activities of the chamber during the past year, showing that much had been accomplished in the way of advertising and publicity. Not only were pamphlets and leaflets printed and distributed throughout the country, but the Portland newspapers were generous in their space, he said.

He called attention to the fact that the chamber had initiated a campaign for street improvements and that the city council had taken up this matter recently with most gratifying results.

#### Include Everything

Jack Milton, owner of Jackson Hot Springs, thought the chamber should advertise and give publicity to all of the scenic attractions and points of interest in the vicinity of Ashland, and E. L. Isaac, chairman of the publicity committee, said that it already had been decided to include all health resorts, including Jackson Hot Springs, Lithia Springs and other similar resorts, in the community advertising which the chamber will undertake during the year.

A tentative budget was submitted by Secretary Fuller and this will be taken up by the budget committee at once in order that a definite budget and campaign of activities can be outlined by the directors at another meeting to be held next week.

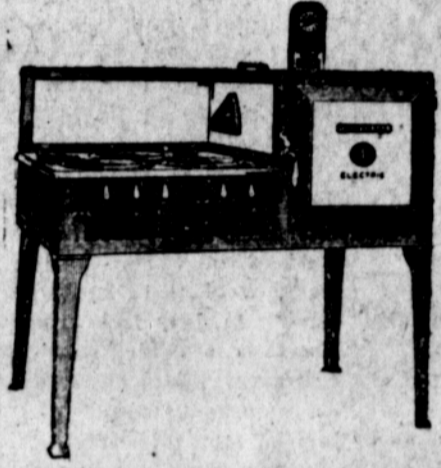
