LONDON, (UP)-A educational conflict has ariser among teachers in English schools by the firm stand of men teachers not to serve under wom en and not to accept a status of equal salary with women. The women teachers claim equal rights and a sex war that threatens to shake the present school system has been declared.

The fight is between the School-master's Association the women's organization which is commonly known as N. U. T. or the National Union of Teachers. The women have been working persistently for a long time, with the result that the men became alarmed and declared open

The schoolmasters passed a resolution, amid much cheering to any assistant-master serving under a head-mistress, and pledged the association to give full finantial support to any member who if called upon to serve under a then, in conference, unanimously took a stand of uncompromising opposition to the principle of equal pay for men and women
