### AIR SUPREMACY

By the middle of May, it is premised, the United States will have the most extensive air service in the world. Its air mail already surpasses that of any other country. It will soon surpass that of any other combination of countries.

Few Americans realize what has been accomplished in aviation, as a result of government pionering. The great transcontinental air mail line between New York and San Francisco, operated by the Postoffice Department, is a proved success and a fixture. With it are being connected a dozen big feeder lines operatd by private enterprise, running to New England, the South, Southwest and Northwest. This branching system, fed in turn by railroad mail trains, will pretty well cover the country, and will continue growing until its facilities are available in every section and every state.

### BURNING PAPER MONEY

Failing in every other plan to restore the value of the franc and save the French government from bankruptcy, some ingenious Frenchmen are urging that half the outstanding paper money be burned.
