### SEVERE MOONSHINE PENALTIES

It will go hard with moonshiners of Illinois, Indiana and Wisconsin, if E. C. Yellowley, prohibition director of that district, carries out a threat he made the other day. Also hard with moonshiners' landlords. The director has dug up an old law of 1857, which was enacted to check moonshining and was much used during the reconstruction period after the Civil War. It will do as well for the present reconstruction period, the director thinks.

This ancient statute provides that both real and personal property used in the illicit manufacture of liquor, and even the land over which moonshiners or bootleggers pass to and from a still, may be forfeited to the government.

Here is a remedy more fearsome than smashing stills and emptying moonshine booze and padlocking doors. It may prove more effective than fines and jail terms. That is, if the moonshiners and bootleggers permit Uncle Sam to use it. We shall believe that 1857 statute is still effective when we see it working.

### TEN POINTS OF STARDOM

Here are 10 qualifications for film actresses, listed by Hollywood executives, and hereby called to the attention of young ladies aspiring to movie honors. They are, in their order of importance, as follows:

First, character; Second, personality; Third, beauty; Fourth, intelligence; Fifth, imagination; Sixth, grace or poise; Seventh, knowledge of drama; Eighth, environment; Ninth, age; Tenth, education.

Speaking in general, this line-up is about what an ordinary observer of movie life and art might expect, with one notable exception. Since who have the film magnates put character first? ### DRIVERS' VISION

The demand for vision tests in granting licenses to drive automobiles is likely to grow. A survey covering a period of 12 months and dealing with 2,000 automobile accident cases reveals these facts:

Out of 600,000 licensed drivers, 66,000 have visual efficiency of 64 per cent without glasses; 12,000 drivers are defective in color perception of red and green; 10,000 are deficient in field of vision; and 7,400 are blind in one eye.

Is it any wonder that there are accidents, that drivers misunderstand signals at night and "preventable" injuries are not prevented? One of these days we will look back in amazement at the time when visual efficiency was not required of automobile drivers.

### ARBITRATION VS. LAW SUITS

Arbitration, as a method of adjusting business controversies, now has the sanction of Federal statute. The Distribution Conference, held under the auspices of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, called attention to the fact that the Federal Arbitration Act became effective Jan. 1, 1926. A written agreement in a contract to submit any controversy arising under the contract to arbitration is valid, irrevocable and enforceable in Federal courts.

For many years electrically controlled clocks have been used in public places. Now the need of a similar timepiece for the home is being filled by the Philadelphia Electric Company. This new clock is a pocket watch which serves as a timepiece for a flat rate. It is a masterpiece which makes a clock his own from a master device in a new way.

This is the best thing in household conveniences. Cost of installation and maintenance is small, and due to high state of electrical development, fear need not exist that an electric clock will be a fire hazard. The system in the Southwest, comprising 1,500 miles of 110,000-volt transmission lines, is said to be entirely regulated from one master clock.
