## WORLD CONGRESS TO DEVELOP RESEARCH

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., May 7.—(UP)—A World Congress of historians is planned for the near future, Prof. Solon J. Buck of the University of Minnesota announced today in outlining a proposed national policy for the American Historical Association to promote "American history and history in America."

The Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial has contributed \$25,000 to the Association, Prof. Buck said, addressing a joint meeting of the Mississippi Valley Historical Association and the Illinois State Historical Society, to aid in organizing a permanent International Committee of His-

torical Sciences, under whose auspices of the Congress, the first since the outbreak of the World War, will be held.

Establishment of a "History House" in Washington to serve as a national center for history and historians was urged by Prof. Buck in advocating expansion of the nation's effort in historical research, for which an Endowment Committee of the Association, headed by former Senator Albert J. Beveridge of Indiana, is now seeking to raise \$1,000,000.
