

DEMISSION TO HAVE BIG FEATURES

COOS BAY, Ore., May 12.—(Special)—Advance reservations for the state convention of the American Legion, Legion Auxiliary and 40 and 50 to be held at Coos Bay, August 5, 6, and 7, indicate an attendance of at least 2500, according to announcements issued today by the convention commission.

In making public the program for the three day session, the commission, which is composed of leaders in North Bend and Marshfield Legion posts, pledges itself to make good on the convention slogan, "Coos Bay Knows How." Advantage will be taken of the natural resources and entertainment features of the district. It was announced, and water sports, free sea-food dinner, trips to the Pacific beaches and a visit to a fleet of six destroyers of the U. S. Navy in Coos Bay harbor will be included.

This convention will be unique in the history of the department of Oregon since it will be the first time that two cities will unite to entertain the state organization. Both Marshfield and North Bend posts have combined to raise a fund of \$5000 for entertainment purposes and active assistance from the civic and commercial organizations has been assured.

Coos Bay may be reached by state highway, Southern Pacific railway, the Nelson Steamship line from Portland and Astoria, and by airplane and each of these routes will undoubtedly be relied upon by delegates.

ASHLAND SCHOOL OF ART TO BE HELD THIS SUMMER

Only White, Director
Courses in Landscape, Still Life, Flower Painting and Descriptive Design will be taught by Miss White who is a teacher in the Pratt Institute and a recognized artist and exhibitor in the important oil and water color societies.

Head Construction and commercial figure drawing, two new and very attractive courses will be under the management of Miss Emily Grace Hanks.

Miss Hanks received the Bronze Medal for antique drawing at the School of the National Academy of Design; attended for four years the General Art course in Pratt Institute, winning a scholarship; had portrait with Robert Heald, and in Paris studied life and portrait with Lucien Simon and Rene Manard; several years in charge of the Studios of the Herter Looms; designer of ten of the tapestries of the "History of New York" for the Hotel McAlpin in New York City, including the large "surrender of Peter Stuyvesant" and the "Opening of the Erie Canal." She was assistant to Mr. Albert Herter on the paintings for the Mar- al Room in the St. Francis Hotel, San Francisco. The distinctive figures in the panel "Europe" were painted by her; also assistant to Mr. Herter on his painting in the State Capitol in Wisconsin. For four years she has been teacher of life classes at Pratt Institute and at the Faneuil School of Industrial Art, Newark, N. J., where classes in portrait have been added for her.

Miss Hanks is known for enthusiasm and originality in her work. She has evolved a method of her own whereby she is able with the use of type solids, to teach the drawing of the hand and figure from a children. A forty-five hour course in each of these subjects is offered.

Design, Method of Teaching and Commercial Art will be directed by Mr. Felix Payant, graduate of art in the University School of Cincinnati and in Evan- der Childs High School, New York City; is a contributor to Design, a magazine for craftsmen and art teachers, especially noted in his series of articles on Teaching of Design.

Of especial interest is the fact that Mr. Payant is arranging with the Superintendent of Art in the New York City High Schools to have a typical New York City High School Art Exhibit sent out to Ashland this summer. This will be of great value to any teachers of art in any of the schools of Oregon.

Design students enter the trade directly from the New York City Schools.

Crafts, and all applied work, Costume Accessories, Lamp shades, and other decorations for the home will be taught by Miss Ethel M. Weightman, who was instructor in the school last year.

Of special interest as showing the reputation of Miss White and her company, workers of the Pratt Institute of Art, is the fact that inquiries have been coming in from all over the country and pupils are enrolling from Oak Park,

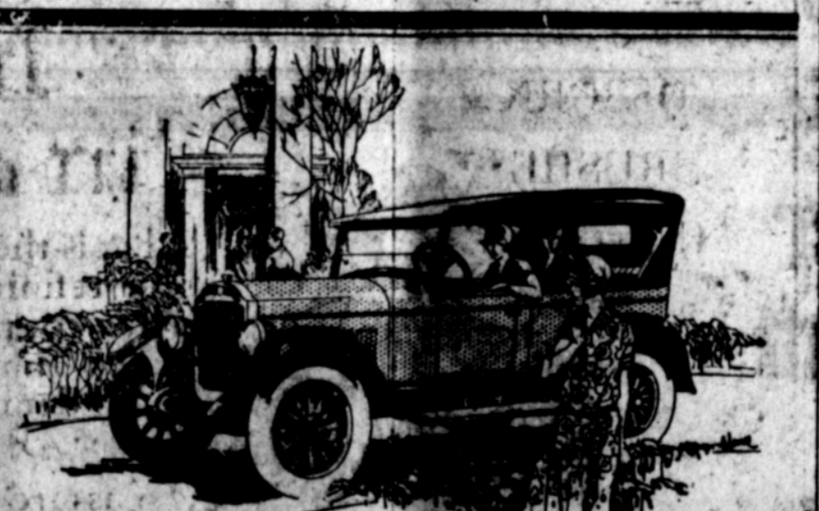
