**WIVES OF PEASANTS STAGE REAL STRIKE**

MOSCOW. (UP)—A wives' strike, the first recorded in Russian history, proved a complete success in the obscure peasant village of Karmava; and some hundred brawny peasants now stand in proper awe of their better halves.

The moving spirit in the strike was the peasant woman Aksinia Karaseev, who had become an enthusiastic convert to the Communist idea that women should take an active part in public life. Aksinia excited first the surprise and then the indignation of her husband, Semyon, by gadding

about from meeting to meeting instead of working from morning till night as a model peasant wife is supposed to do. By way of teaching, Aksinia that woman's place is in the home Semyon, in typical Russian peasant fashion, took his wife over his knee and gave her a sound spanking.

But Aksinia, filled with the ideas of new womanhood, was not so helpless as is the ordinary peasant woman before the violence of her lord and master. She called out the other women in the village, most of whom had marital grievances of their own, and rallied them in the village school house on a militant "Woman's Rights" platform. Not a stroke of work was to be done until husbands promised to cease beating and abusing them.

The males of the village suddenly found the houses deserted, the children untended, the cows unmilked. They assembled, and marched on the school house, determined to make short work of the women's rebellion. But they found the entrance to the school well barricaded; and the spectacle of a hundred women firmly united on a programme of passive resistance caused the sturdiest of the peasants to scratch their heads in perplexity.

The affair ended with a complete victory for the women, at least on paper. The husbands

sheepishly signed a pledge to refrain from beating or cursing their spouses in the future; and the triumphant women returned to their homes to still the protesting cries of the deserted children and farm animals.
