TOURIST CAMP SANITATION IN OREGON

With nearly one-half of the people having access to automobiles and consequently spending a considerable portion of their time on the highways of the nation, the importance of maintaining sanitary conditions along these same highways becomes self evident. Water supplies. sewage disposal facilities, fly protection, mosquito eradication and protection of food are of the utmost import-

In order that the tourists may be assured of safe water and sanitary toilet facilities in the state of Oregon, regular inspection of tourist camps is now required by law. The owners of the tourist camps have agreed to comply with the rules and regulations of the State Board of Health and to co-operate with the inspection service which this department maintains through the County Health Officer. Buildings of course have been remodeled. As a matter of fact, many tourist camps maintain comfort stations equal to those found in our best hotels. Water supplies are uniformly satisfactory due to the fact that these supplies are regularly examined in the laboratory of the Oregon State Board of Health.

The following regulations concerning the sanitation of tourist camps were adopted by the State Board of Health on March 25, 1925:

Each tourist camp shall have an adequate supply of water of good sanitary quality from a source which will meet the requirements of the Oregon State Board of Health as to sanitary location, construction and operation. Common drinking cups are prohibited for use at these

Disposal of Excreta: Fly-tight privies or water-flushed toilets with a system of sewage disposal approved by the State Board of Health shall be provided and shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Separate toilets for men and women shall be provided; one toilet for each 25 men and one for each 25 women.

Disposal of Refuse: Supervision and equipment sufficient to prevent littering the ground with rubbish, garbage or other refuse shall be provided and maintained. Fly-tight depositories for such material shall be provided and conspicuously located. These depositories shall not be permitted to become foul smelling or unsightly, or breeding places for flies.

Camp Sites: Every tourist camp must be located on a site that is well drained and shall be located with regard to its healthfulness,

Inspection of tourist camps is made by the County Health Officer under the supervision of the State Board of Health as often as practicable. The camps are arranged as follows: Class "A" camps complying with every regulation. Class "B" camps comply with all the regulations except those regarding some of the building re-strictions. Class "C" camps are temporary permits issued to give the owners time to comply with the regulations. If the recommendations are not carried out and the camp is found in an unsanitary condition upon a second inspeciton, the tourist camp is then closed. This sinp cannot be re-opened until the recommendations have been carried out.
