Federal agents charge them with selling unfermented grape juice but furnishing the purchaser with instructions showing how to permit it to turn into wine with an alcoholic content. The government claims the men are connected with a coast-wide plot for a general violation of the liquor law.

## BALDWIN PROPOSES STRIKE SETTLEMENT

LONDON, May 14.—(UP)—Premier Baldwin's proposal for peace in the mine industry containing a promise of a \$15,000,000 government subsidy, was announced today. Premier Baldwin proposed that the subsidy be paid over an indefinite period but it is contingent upon the acceptance by the miners and owners of the remainder of his proposal which provides for a settlement of all disputes in the industry.

## Coast Rum King Indicted Again

SEATTLE, Wash., May 14.—(UP)—Roy Olmstead, king of the Pacific coast rum runners, surrendered himself to federal authorities today in answer to new grand jury indictments charging him with liquor smuggling conspiracies. Olmstead was the central figure in the notorious Olmstead rum ring broken up last summer and is now at liberty under bonds. He is under sentence to four years in prison.


## Registration In Oregon Falls Off

PORTLAND, Ore., May 14.—(UP)—There are 293,512 registered voters in Oregon according to a compilation of registration lists by Secretary of State Koser. This is more than 30,000 less than the number registered for the last general election.
