Reserved Seats Collapse at Circus

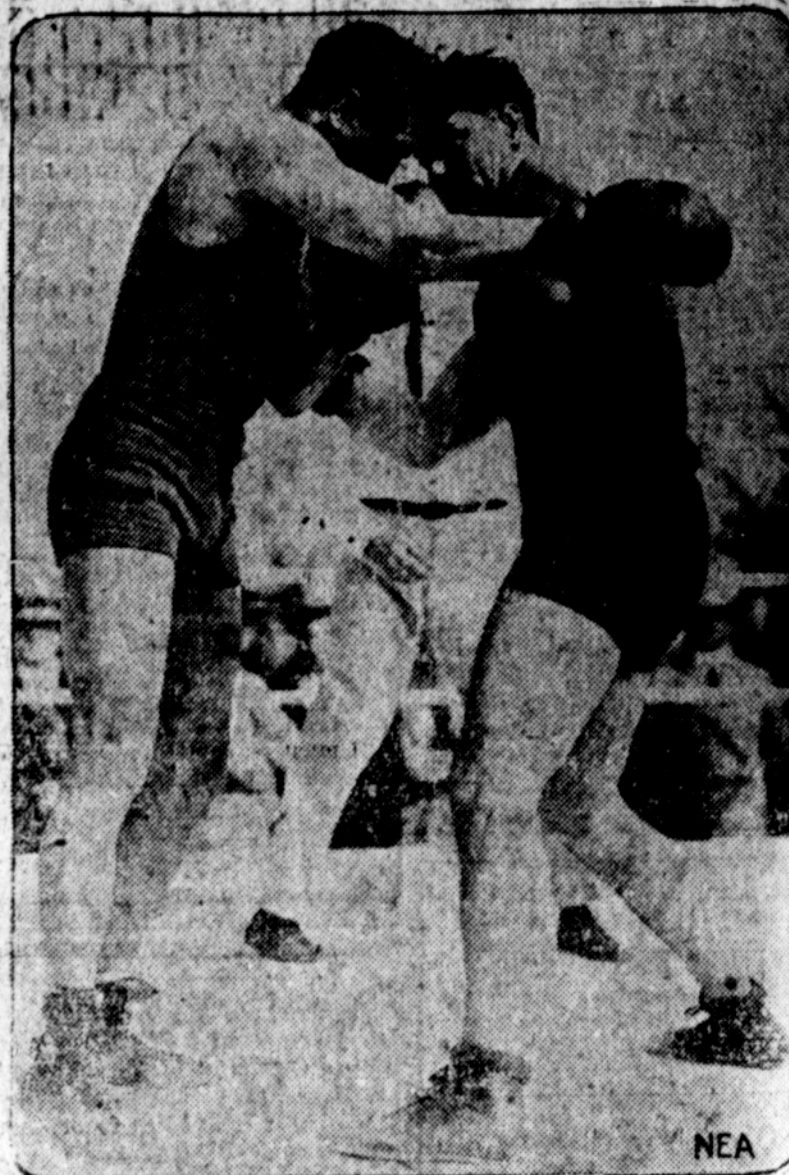

ANN ARBOR, Mich., May 11. (UP)—Through ultra-violet ray treatments, an ordinary milk cow may be induced to produce milk which cures rickets, according to Dr. Howard B. Lewis, of the University of Michigan. The milk has a higher anti-ricket content than either cod liver oil or calcium, he said.
