EIGHTH GRADERS TO BE GIVEN DIPLOMAS

School Superintendent Carter Plans Big Commencement day Next Friday

This week sees the end of the school work in twenty-four more districts of the county, so that with exception of eight districts all schools will be closed. Medford schools, Central Point, Sams Valley, Prospect, and four rural schools continue for either one week or two weeks longer.

The State eighth grade examinations were written last week by about 260 eighth grade pupils, exclusive of Ashland and Medford, and the county examining board is profoundly busy this week in grading some 2500 papers.

County Superintendent Carter is arranging for the Jackson County School Day to be held in Ashland on Friday May 28th. This is the graduation day of all of the eighth grade pupils of the county, and this year is the fifty year of observance. Besides the commencement program at the Chautauqua building in the morning, there will be in the afternoon the Music Memory contest for teams of the county, and a program of music, drills, etc. Lithia Park will be given over for the day as picnic grounds, and in the afternoon games and events will be carried on under direction of Coach Hughes and Mr. Howell. The aim is to make it a County wide day in attendance, when all who are interested in education of Jackson County's young people shall assemble. Many communities make it an annual picnic day and give themselves fully to enjoyment of the day's programs.
