Fifteen Cases Reported There During Past Week, Say Health Officers

CONTAMINATED WATER

Homes Under Quarantine; Rigid Measures Taken to Prevent Epidemic

WEED, Cal., May 25. - The outbreak of typhoid fever in Weed and its sudden spread caused Drs. W. E. Tebbe and C. W. Nutting to use drastic measures to get the disease under control.

Fifteen cases have been placed under quarantine.

With a strict quarantine over the cases reported efforts were centered on discovering the source of the origin of the disease and when this was found other measures became necessary. The water in Bowles creek was declared contaminated and people living along the creek were notified. Bowles and McMahon creeks have been posted with placards warning the public of the condition of the water.

The state board of health and the state dairy inspectors were notified and a state nurse was dispatched from Calexico, where she had been on similar outbreaks. and she is assisting with the patients and making investigations. Officials from the board of health and dairy division are also at Weed and precautions are being taken to keep the disease out of the public schools. All parents of school children have been notified that free vaccine and vaccination of the children may be
