## Too Many Laws Declares Judge

PORTLAND, Ore. — (AP) — If the present scale of enacting new legislation continues, it will require the services of one out of every ten Americans to administer the law and otherwise aid the functioning of government, according to Judge John K. Stevenson of Portland.

"One cannot traverse the city of Portland from one boundary line to another without breaking several laws, no matter how good a citizen and how careful he is," declared Judge Stevenson.

"This clamor for law and more law, with requests that articles be used to enforce it, is dangerous. No law should be passed until the demand for it becomes general and when it is passed it should be enforced."

SAN FERNANDO, Cal. — (AP) — Petrified remains of a gigantic whale which probably took its last swim in the Miocene age, nearly 5,000,000 years ago, were recently uncovered in San Fernando valley.

The finds were "field stones," which Dr. A. J. Tjeje, geologist of the University of Southern California, declared were petrified vertebrae from the backbone of a whale.
