## PONZI GETS CHANCE TO SETTLE AFFAIRS

Former Financial Wizard Must Appear Soon to Get Court Sentence

BOSTON, June 5.—A five day stay of sentence was granted to Charles Ponzi, financial "wizard" by Judge Frederick Fosdick in superior court here.

This action followed a receipt of a telegram from Ponzi requesting ten days in which "to settle his affairs," in Jacksonville, Fla. The judge ruled that Ponzi should have just five days to appear in court for sentence of seven to nine years as a "common and notorious thief," and ordered a default warrant, which had been issued withdrawn.
