CONTINENT JOINS KIWANIS TRIBUTE UNITED GOOD WILL

MONTREAL, June 8.—Montreal, cradle of the white man's civilization some 400 years ago, opened its historic gates of welcome to 7,000 Kiwanians today who have traveled from every conceivable place on the North American continent to meet here for the 10th annual convention of Kiwanis International this week. Crowding to the city's immense auditorium "Forum" last night, 10,000 Canadian and American Kiwanians and visitors attended the opening "All Kiwanis Night" program, while millions of radio listeners in the United States and Canada heard the international expression of gratitude for the friendship, peace, and understanding that has existed between the two countries for more than a hundred years.

While 7,000 delegates and visiting Kiwanians paid their homage in this city, one hundred thousand other members scattered in cities from the Atlantic to the Pacific and the Gulf of Mexico to the far north across the miles of expanse of the Canadian provinces, met simultaneously during the opening convention hour to observe a continent-wide fellowship spirit of understanding. Radio broadcasting brought the program to members thousands of miles from Montreal.

"Organization such as yours—do much to strengthen the bonds of mutual amity and understanding between our people and other countries," was President Coolidge's statement read to the convention.

ANNOUNCE WINNERS IN MUSIC CONTEST

The climax of the school year's efforts in Music appreciation and Music Memory work was reached at Jackson County School Day in Ashland when several teams of five members competed. None of the one-room schools of the county entered contestants, though the work had been carefully given in several of these schools.

In the first try out, the Butte Falls team scored highest average winning first place. Mrs. Rhea Hoer, teacher; Phoenix team scored second. Mrs. Edith Fish, teacher; and Oak Grove third, third. Mrs. Thornton, teacher; with Lone Pine standing fourth, Mrs. Grace Childreth, teacher. One hundred per cent scores were made by three boys from Butte Falls, three boys from Phoenix and Mary Spider from Oak Grove.

In the second try out of these seven individual pupils the six boys still scored high making us wonder if the American boy has keener ear than the American girl. A third and a fourth try out were held before highest place was determined and Joe Hartley of Phoenix stood 100 per cent at last trial so winning highest prize of \$3.00. The six boys of Phoenix and Butte Falls teams received the cash prizes donated by the Ashland Chamber of Commerce.

For the last three years Ashland's Chamber has sponsored the music memory work by giving the cash prizes, while Palmer Piano House of Medford and the Rose of Ashland have to the winning teams given prizes of Victrola records amounting to five or six dollars each.

Soviet Plan Of Government Fails

SAN FRANCISCO, (UP)—Sovietism has failed in Russia, and with this failure will come the ultimate failure of Bolshevism's projects over the world, according to George Thomas Marye, former ambassador to czarist Russia. Marye, accompanied by his wife, has just returned to California from a several months' tour of Russia. His home is in Burlingame, a residential community outside San Francisco.

"Business throughout Russia," Marye said, "still is in the hands of the government. It will take Russia a long time to get back to what we call normal, once the present form of government has been modified."

"But the menace of Bolshevism is over. The world may sigh with relief."

Marye was ambassador to Russia from 1914 to 1916, when he resigned the post. He holds the Order of St. Nicholas Nevsky, given him by Nicholas II, and is the only foreign envoy to have ever been so honored. He left Petrograd a few weeks before the revolution of 1916.
