time, providing the driver remains in the car on the street side, with engine running and ready to move at any time.

Stop signals are provided at the intersection of Main with North Pioneer and Oak streets, and additional stop signals were suggested for the intersection of Main with North First, Granite and other streets.

It is understood that these changes in the parking will be made at once.

In recommending the new parking system, Manager Malone acknowledged that in the trial of the parallel parking along the Plaza discrimination had been shown, but stated this had been intended

for only a short time, but said the new system would make conditions equal throughout the city. He emphasized that Main street in Ashland was the Pacific highway and that the city should recognize the rights of the tourists to be able to drive through the city without danger to their cars.

VETO MESSAGE TO THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND

I hereby veto Ordinance No. 824 of the City of Ashland passed by the Common Council at an adjourned meeting thereof held on the tenth day of June, 1926. My reasons for vetoing the said ordinance are as follows:

Denying either public or private, has never been classed as a crime or immoral practice by the laws of the state of Oregon, or the ordinances of the city of Ashland.

The most that we can say in regard to public dances is that the only thing required is proper supervision or regulation, and this is made necessary only by reason of the fact that public dances are open to all, and there are always some who cannot conduct themselves properly whether it be at a dance, on the street or at any public gathering.

The ordinance on its face purports to simply license public dances, but in view of the fact that certain members of the Common Council proposing it have indicated that it is but a means to prohibit public dancing in Lithia Park by refusing to grant a license therefor, the issue really becomes one as to whether or not the Common Council is to prohibit dancing in Lithia Park or not.

The Park Board is an elective board and under the charter is given control of Lithia Park, subject only to general laws of the city, state and nation. It is my belief that the members of the Common Council should not take the attitude that they are the only ones who can think rightly on any question, but should give the members of the Park Board credit for being men of equal intelligence and of equal soundness of opinion.

I believe in proper supervision and regulation, but I believe the present attempt to defeat public dancing in Lithia Park is unreasonable and is a matter which should be left to the discretion of the Park Commission or the electors of the city of Ashland.
