NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons interested in the ownership of any parcel of land abutting on the following streets: - Church, Bush, Upper Almond, Manzanita, Wimer, Nursery, Coolidge, North Main and Central Avenue, and Factory Street - that it is proposed by the Common Council of said City to construct cement sidewalks, curbs and gutters on said streets between the following named points, excepting where such improvements already exist.

Church Street - Certain curbs and gutters now in place to be lowered or replaced. All sidewalks not now in place to be built. Bush Street - Sidewalks, curbs and gutters from North Main Street to Almond Street, both sides.

Upper Almond Street - Sidewalks, curbs and gutters on west side from Bush to Manzanita Street. Wimer Street - Sidewalks, curbs and gutters from North Main Street to Scenic Drive, both sides.

SEALED PROPOSALS will be received by the Common Council of the City of Ashland, Oregon, until 5 o'clock P. M., June 22nd, 1926, at the Recorder's Office, and such proposals will be opened and considered the same day and date at 2 o'clock P. M. for the construction and installation of a sewer in sewer dist. No. 27. Said district comprises a sewer extending from Ashland Street

Manzanita St. - Sidewalks, curbs and gutters on both sides from North Main St. to Upper Almond St. Wimer St. - Sidewalks, curbs and gutter from North Main St. to Scenic Drive.

Nursery St. - Sidewalks, curbs and gutters from North Main St. to Scenic Drive. Coolidge St. - Sidewalks, curbs and gutters on North side of street only, from North Main St. to Scenic Drive.

North Main St. - Sidewalk, curb and gutter on westerly side only, from Coolidge St. to the Northerly side line of Lot No. 12 in Mayor's Addition, excepting a walk where same is now in place.

Factory St. - Sidewalks, curbs and gutters on Northerly side only, from North Main St. to Laurel St. Total - 9500 feet of walk, curb and gutter. Cost - \$18000.00.

Authority is requested to give notice of intention to construct same. Under authority granted April 27, 1926, a plan is hereby submitted covering parking regulations in the City of Ashland.

It will be noted that parallel parking is recommended throughout with the exception of the North side of Main St. from Plummers Grocery to North Pioneer and South side of Main St. from alley below Tidings Office to South Pioneer.

Also on the West side of First St. from Main St. to the alley between Main and C St. The parking limit to be one hour between the hours of 8 A. M. and 5 P. M. on Main St. from 3rd to Plaza, the Plaza and out North Main St. to Helman, also on First St. from Main St. to alley between Main and C Streets.

No restrictions as to parking limit on other streets except that all night parking will not be permitted on any street as specified in Ordinance No. 211, passed Sept. 29, 1925, Section 6 of above Ordinance. Also gives Chief of Police full power to designate the number of parking that shall be used in the City of Ashland.

Two cards are also submitted, one covering signals, and reprint of certain section of city traffic ordinance, the other shows diagrammatically how to handle car to park parallel with reprint of certain traffic instructions.

It will also be permissible to double park where parallel parking is used for short periods of time providing the driver remains in the car on the street side, with engine running and ready to move at any time.

Stop signals will be printed on the pavement at the intersection of Oak St. and North Pioneer with Main St. All cars approaching Main St. on either Oak or North Pioneer will be requested to come to full stop before entering Main St.

This plan has been considered and considerable thought and attention. With the approval of the Chief of Police. Approval of the Council of this plan is requested and authority granted to have two thousand copies printed for distribution, these cards to be placed in Hotels, Chamber of Commerce and such other places as Chief of Police may designate. California To Vote On Racing

SAN FRANCISCO, June 12. - (UP) - Initiative petitions have been placed in circulation seeking to have a racing bill put on the ballot at the November election. The measure permits the betting on horse races by use of the pari-mutuel system, but continues to prohibit bookmaking and pool selling that were outlawed when horse racing was stopped in California 15 years ago, according to H. J. Macomber, chairman of the committee sponsoring the petition.

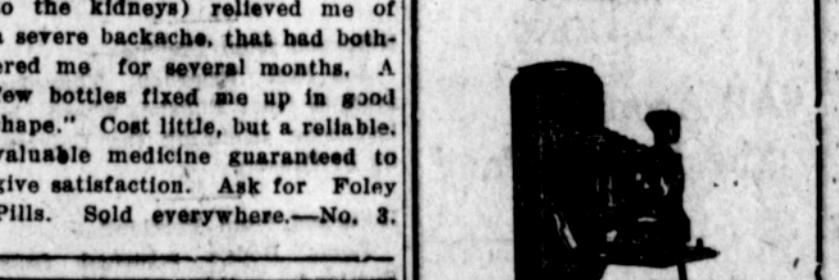
