RECALLS REPEAL OF SPECIAL TAX

Covers Pool Halls, For Hire Automobiles and Bowling Alleys

PORTLAND, Ore., June 15.—Clyde G. Huntley, collector of internal revenue, today called particular attention to the repeal of the federal tax on pool and billiard tables, for hire automobiles and bowling alleys, effective June 30. Heretofore these taxes have been paid by approximately 1700 taxpayers in this state. Collector Huntley also reminds corporations that, effective on the same date, the capital stock has been repealed with the result that some 500 corporations in this state are relieved from filing capital stock tax returns.

"In fact," Collector Huntley points out, "the new revenue law repealed all of the federal occupational taxes, with the exception of that imposed on wholesale and retail liquor dealers, and manufacturers of stills. The 1926 law abolishes the following annual occupational taxes, effective with the close of the fiscal year, June 30: "Brokers, \$50; pawnbrokers, \$100; ship brokers, \$50; custom-house brokers, \$50; proprietors of pool and billiard rooms and bowling alleys, \$10; per table or alley; shooting galleries, \$20; riding academies, \$100; for hire automobiles, \$10 to \$20 per car; tobacco manufacturer's tax, \$6 to \$24. This does not affect the tax on manufactured tobacco. The special tax on boats has been changed to apply only to foreign built boats.

"Although the capital stock tax has been repealed and no further returns are necessary, corporations are reminded that these returns should not be confused with corporation income tax returns which all corporations are required to file annually. Neither is the capital stock tax to be confused with the tax on capital stock issues and transfers. The latter is a stamp tax pure and simple and is retained in the present revenue law."

(Continued from page 1.) If the voters at the special elec-

tion reject the ordinance passed by the council, dancing will continue in the park and in all other places in the city where licenses are procured as under the old ordinance now on the statute books.

If the voters at the special election July 30th approve the ordinance, public dancing will immediately be illegal except upon the approval of a license upon the approval of the city council, and, as the councilmen who sponsored this ordinance have stated repeatedly, "there will be no more public dancing."
