Mr. Carter also recited many humorous incidents in connection with the early work of the bank. One of the largest stockholders in the bank came to the office one day with a buckskin sack, containing gold, with the request that the money be left in the bag and that he would come in and take out as he needed it. Mr. Carter stated it required a long explanation to show the stockholder that the regular form and checked out.

Different Atmosphere He said in the early days the stock growers and farmers, who received most of their money in the fall from the sale of their products, had been in the habit of leaving this money each fall with the merchants and then usuing as they desired. It required considerable time to break down this custom and acquaint the people with the advantage of depositing their funds in the bank.
