THE NEW ELEMENT IN BUSINESS

A comparatively short time ago industry was considered to be divided into two separate camps—capital and labor. This condition no longer obtains. Today industry is made up of three distinct departments-capital, labor and management. Capital represents of nership and may be one individual or thousands upon thousands of stockholders, many of whom are ordinarily considered as part of the labor or management group.

Labor represents the human element of production and may be a small gang of unskilled laborers or a huge organization of thousands of people ranging from the porter who sweeps the floors to the research engineer, who designs new processes or machines. Labor through stock ownership in the industry in which it toils, may also be considered as a part of the capital group.

Management represents the control of industry and may be a single foreman or a complex staff organization of hundreds of pepole. It is the function of management to: coordinate the efforts of labor and capital toward greater productive efficiency per dollar invested and
