But in view of the context and picturization of the cartoon itself, and in view of the further message carried by all the publicity in the Portland newspapers in furtherance of the campaign being True, our mother watched above promoted, such an interpretation is strained and only to be accounted for on the premise of super-sensativeness or rancor on the part of the critics.

In the sober consciousness of the state there is the knowledge that progress in Portland means progress in all Oregon. Portland knows full well that its progress is in proportion to the progress of Oregon. It is an erroneous viewpoint on the part of individuals in Portland or in the state at large that would separate one from the other. For Portland is a part of Oregon, just as Eugene is, or Salem or Klamath Falls or Ashland. Oregon produces. Portland's markets and manufactures and shipping takes the greater part of Oregon's products. The rest of Oregon and Portland are interdependent upon one another and the advantage is not to either side. They move forward together or they lag.

This newspaper believes the majority 'disposition throughout the rest of Oregon is one of cooperation with Portland, and that the majority sentiment is one of friendliness toward Portland. And on Portland's side, and particularly on the part of the Portland chamber of commerce, there has not been lacking manifestation of the spirit of cooperation with the rest of the state. An Oregon developmnt fund of \$300,000 was raised by Pertland chamber of commerce in Portland and expended for the development of Oregon at large. And then a second fund of \$250,000 was raised similarly and is now being expended similarly. 


