at Mexicali. Traveling through lower California and into Sonora, she escaped from her captors, a man named "Steve" and a woman named "Rosa", she declared. She made her way painfully on foot over burning Sonora sand dunes to Agua Prieta, just across the line from Douglas. The kidnaping charge is almost identical with that related by Mrs. Virginia Lee Cookson, authoress, who last August claimed she was carried

into Mexico and held in an underground den, where she declared she saw Dorothy Arnold, New York heiress, who disappeared a decade ago was never solved.

DOUGLAS, Ariz.,—June 23.—Mrs. McPherson said she escaped

from her abductors about noon yesterday, and walked until she reached Agua Prieta. She said she could give no clue to their identity. She was unharmed, although she said her captors frequently threatened to abuse her unless a big ransom was forthcoming.
