Not every parent, unfortunately is intelligent enough to know that there must be co-operation. The Parent - Teacher Association can help to spread the gospel. - such stupidity? Parents often criticise the work of a teacher whose room they have never visited. You can't fairly criticise what you haven't seen. And you can't believe all that children report - you ought to hear what they tell us about you! The Parent - Teacher Association must encourage school visiting-Italy plans to marry his daughter, not en masse, on special occasions, but everyday visiting - seeing a session through.
