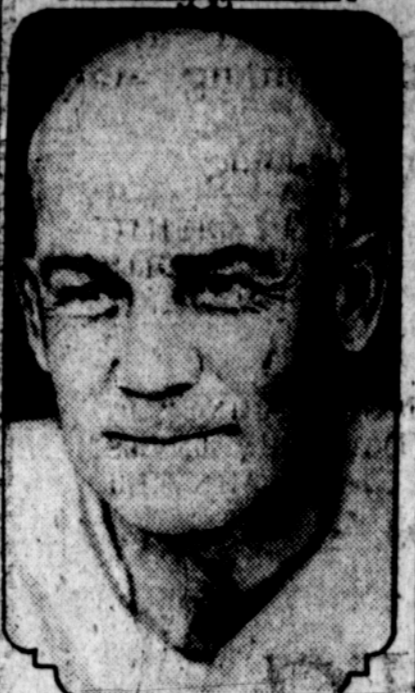
#### Crater National Forest
