Editor The Tidings:
The annual time for suggestions for more water for Ashland has arrived again—Why not a little experimenting along with talk and engineering reports—Why not go up the canyon in some of those semi-wet places and dig a well or two. I think those practically dry springs could be made to flow a nice stream of water by digging down and blasting to open up the crevices in the rocks. All such springs could be operated by automatic siphon—at no expense for us-keep.

Then we would have water come down the creek pure and cold as it does now, instead of becoming contaminated more or less from storage reservoir. If dug wells do not get results we still have the deep well to fall back on. Most people on the coast seem to think if they cannot see the water on top of the ground there is no hope. Where I came from they never looked on top of the ground for water, they just picked the place where they wanted to build a house or a town and bored down to water. They had just as much water in the mountains as we.
