A NORMAL DORMITORY

One of the matters on which the Jackson county legislative delegation must work as a unit at the forthcoming session is an appropriation for a dormitory building for the young women attending the Southern Oregon State Normal school.

The urgent need for such a building has been shown during the present summer session of the normal school. Situated as it is on the southern edge of the city, the normal school building is too far for young women students who live in other residential sections of the city.

As an emergency measure an auto bus line is now operating from the business district to the normal school on regular schedules, but in anticipation of the day when the Ashland normal will be training 500 or more young women it is vitally necessary that an adequate dormitory be provided.

The time is opportune right now for citizens of this section to begin emphasizing the need of this addition to the normal school as it will make the work of procuring the needed appropriation just that much easier for the Southern Oregon legislative delegation when the session convenes next January.

ALWAYS ON DUTY

As a usual thing it is only when spectacular arrests are made or spectacular fires are subdued that the work of the police and fire departments receive recognition, but the people of Ashland have every reason to be justly proud of their police and fire bureaus.

Ashland is noted up and down the Pacific coast because it is singularly free from crime of all descriptions. And the reason for this enviable record is because of the day-by-day work of its police force. These men may not be getting their names in the head-lines, but they are always on duty, 24 hours out of every day, and it is because of this faithful service that Ashland citizens can sleep with their doors unlocked, with every assurance that their rest will be undisturbed.

The same applies to the fire department. It has been many months since Ashland has had a serious fire. Figured on a pro rata basis, the city's fire loss will compare favorably with any city on the coast. Day after day the fire department has demonstrated that it is quick to get on the job, and that it knows just what to do when it gets there.

But little glory goes to the men in these departments, but because they are competent and faithful to the public Ashland is enabled to live in peace and security.

BASEBALL VINDICATES ITSELF

Baseball is still the national sport — in Ashland. The faith and prophecies of those who sponsored this city's entry into the Southern Oregon Baseball League have been fulfilled. The club's winning streak during the past four weeks has fanned the baseball spark into a flame, and Ashland right now is second only to Klamath Falls in baseball attendance. Baseball is a good, clean sport as it is being played here in Ashland and else where in the Southern Oregon League. From all indications, baseball has returned to Ashland to stay.

USE COMMON SENSE INSTEAD OF SHOVEL

In the campaign of education to prevent forest fires, a suggestion is made that campers and picnickers carry with them "long-handled shovels" to be used in smothering camp fires with earth, says the Seattle Times.

A better suggestion would be, for each camper or picniker to carry a little "long-headedness" into the fire hazard zones. A camping party plentifully supplied with common sense and longheadedness, will not need other materials with which to cope with the remains of a sensible fire.

Prevent fires through moderate, reasonable use of the forest. Protect the right to renew your youth by occasional contact with nature, unimpeded by other men, and there will be no need for carrying curative weapons into the forest.

Is the unthinking, boastful fool who misuses the privilege of enjoying nature at her best, and such invidious a menace wherever they are to be found.

WASHINGTON—Minnesota has two really remarkable representatives in the United States Senate — Henrik Shipstead and Thomas D. Schall.

Each is an unusual man, and they present a striking contrast. Shipstead, the senior as a senator, though junior in years, is the lone Farmer-Labor senator. Schall is blind.

Shipstead is a radical; Schall a "regular" of the Republican faith.

It's surprising that the same state should have sent to the Senate two such different individuals.

At least they're alike in one respect. They both know how to fight.

Schall made his initial speech on the Senate floor a few days ago—not his first in Congress, for he served five terms as a representative, but his first in the upper house.

It was a rip-snorter. Schall won over Magnus Johnson in the election of 1924 and Magnus filed a contest. It dragged along until the day Schall made that speech. A resolution—which was adopted—had been introduced declaring the contest all off and Schall entitled to his Senate seat.

Schall thought the time had come to tell what he thought about the people who put Johnson up, so he said, to contest his election. He surely told.

He didn't blame Magnus much. He said "he never knew what it was all about."

But for the contest's "instigators"—well, such expressions as assassins of character, slander, skunks, perjurers, blackmailing, pettifogger, conscienceless slyster, lying tongue, fell thick and fast from the senator's lips as he talked.

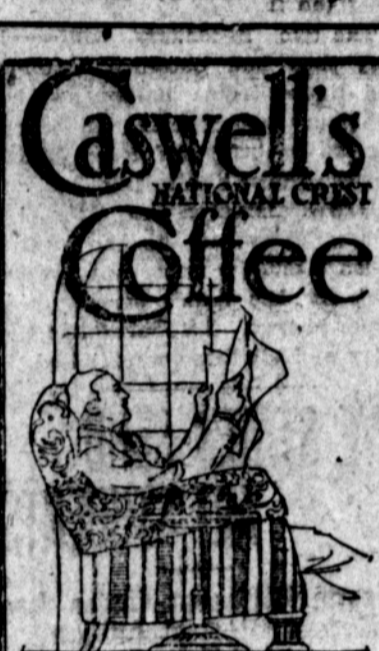
