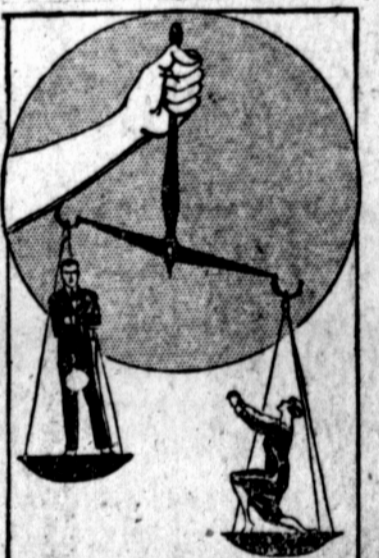

NORTH BEND, Ore., June 30.—(UP)—R. T. Bourne, manager of the Stout Lumber company's large mill here, announced today that commencing July 17th all departments of the mill will be closed for an indefinite period, owing to "deplorable conditions of the lumber market." The closing affects 200 men.

Women Talk More Than Mere Males

SACRAMENTO, Cal., June 30.—It's all settled now—that question of whether women outtalk men. They do.

So says E. Fred Duden, chief of the staff of official reporters who take down and transcribe proceedings in the civil department of the Sacramento county superior court.

In sustaining the contention, long held by husbands, Duden declared:

"When it comes to talking the average man cannot hold a candle to the average woman for speed. There are, of course, exceptional men who talk every bit as fast as the average women on the witness stand, but they are few and far between.

"The rapidity probably is accounted for by a difference in temperament. Women are generally more nervously constituted than men."
