ADVERTISEMENT FOR PROPOSALS TO CONSTRUCT CURB AND GUTTER

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that sealed proposals will be received by the Common Council of the City of Ashland, Oregon, until 6 o'clock P. M. Tuesday, July 6, 1926, to furnish all material and labor necessary to construct curb and gutter to the extent of approximately 1500 linear feet on C Street between Second and Fifth Streets in the City of Ashland, Oregon. Such proposals will be opened and considered the same day and date at 8:30 o'clock P. M.

A certified check for \$25.00, payable to the City of Ashland, must accompany all bids, which amount the successful bidder shall forfeit to the City in case he shall fail to execute a contract and furnish an approved bond for the faithful performance of such contract, within two days after notification of acceptance of the bid.

The person or persons to whom the contract is awarded shall, within two days after notification, Sunday excluded, execute a contract to construct such curbs and gutters according to plans and specifications in the office of the City Engineer of said city, and furnish an approved bond in an amount of not less than twenty per cent of the contract price for the faithful performance of the contract.

Bidders must examine the ground for the curbs and gutters that no misunderstanding may exist.

The Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

The contract price is to be paid from special assessments for benefits accruing from such curbs and gutters to the respective properties.

All bids should be addressed to the City Recorder.
